
Thank you for making it a memorable occasion for all and for supporting us to continue to provide opportunities for our young people through scouting!

Harvest Service Festival at Brockhall

Sunday 2nd November saw the beautiful church of St Peter and St Paul, Brockhall, decorated for Harvest Festival. The traditionally baked, golden harvest loaf (complete with a rather plump Harvest Mouse with currant eyes – yes he rose a bit too much in the oven) was placed up at the altar along with turnips, swedes, cabbage, cauliflower, potatoes, carrots, apples and pears. The font was also decorated with small apples. Vegetables and wheat gathered from the local fields after harvest during the summer was placed on the sloping window-ledges of this ancient church along with autumnal decorations such as Chinese Lanterns and teasels. Little posies tied with coloured ribbon,



(remembering the colours adopted by the Great War Women's Land Army) were placed on pews for the congregation to take home with them as a reminder of how incredible nature is and yet also to be both mindful of where our food comes from and how it is produced and to be thankful for the constant hard work of farmers and of everyone who works in agriculture. Finally, to remember how the church was so connected to agriculture in centuries past and how it still remains connected to it today.

I would like to say a special thank you to Sheila Long for her kindness and flexibility in letting me decorate the church and for being so helpful in letting me into the church early which was a great help. Also thanks to Reverend Stephen for taking the service, my boyfriend Andy for his help with setting up and to Sheila's daughter for helping me with packing away. To those that attended, you made the service very special.

Thursday 25th **December, 11.00am**. Flore Chapel, URC. A family service. We are all (particularly children) encouraged to bring our favourite small gift to show.




It's Panto Season – oh, yes it is! — 27th-29th December

Flore Parish Council News

Village services and safety

The village has seen some welcome improvements this month, helping us all feel a little safer and more connected as we head into the festive season.

- The Parish Council have carried out an audit of our LED, energy conserving street lights and have repaired the broken light on Sutton Street. If you spot any further streetlights that need attention, please do get in touch with the Parish Clerk.
- Flooding remains a key concern, but positive progress is being made. The Flooding Working Group continues to forge ahead, supported by local volunteers including Councillor Curran who has joined the team. Recent inspections, including of the drain alongside the Millennium Hall, all aim to try to keep water flowing freely and reduce the risk of future issues.
- Several planning applications—from house extensions to tree works and a small fibre cable installation—have been carefully reviewed to ensure they respect the character of our village while keeping everyone safe.
- The village's finances remain in good order, supporting both practical needs and community initiatives. Recent payments covered streetlight electricity, grass cutting, and Messenger printing. Reserves remain healthy, ensuring funds are available for future projects.

Traffic Safety

Traffic safety on the High Street is under review. Recognising that the improvements to the high street need further analysis, the council has been considering a number of financially viable options and seeking best practice examples across the county. Under consideration for example are speed cushions, which are being used successfully in other locations within the county. The council has agreed a site visit with WNC to discuss the traffic situation and other areas that would benefit from attention. We will keep you updated...

Community News

- Brodie Lodge Playing Field Trust have announced that they will be able to welcome a brand-new skateboard ramp next year. The charitable trust was set up in 1999 by a group of villagers to take on the management and upkeep of this wonderful asset in our village. The field was donated by the son of Sir Oliver Lodge, an eminent scientist and socialist, who was the first person to transmit radio waves along a wire in 1888, and later he went on to invent electric spark ignition for the petrol engine!
- The Richard Capell Educational Trust has re-elected Mike Penn as Chair. The foundation provides small grants for educational activities in Flore village.
- Our local climate group has refreshed its name to the Flore Climate and Nature Group to reflect its broadening focus.
- A reminder that appointments are now required before visiting the local tip. You can book online or by calling 0300 126 7000 (Mon-Fri, 9am-5pm).
