Letter from the Rector

Dear Friends.

As you receive this newsletter, we are rapidly approaching the end of the Church Year, and looking forward to Advent Sunday on 30th November. Already, I'm receiving adverts for Advent Calendars and wondering at the number of different ways we could choose to count down the days to Christmas. There seem to be Advent Calendars for everything these days – chocolate (of course), Lego, dice, highland cows (!?), and beauty products to name just a few. Even the Tank Museum at Bovington are offering an Advent Calendar with a tiny tank a day to hang on your Christmas Tree!!

The last few days, as shops have put away the Halloween stuff for another year, and displayed more Christmas lines, a verse from a nursery rhyme has been going around in my head; *Christmas is coming, the goose is getting fat. Please put a penny in the old man's hat. If you haven't got a penny, a ha'penny will do. If you haven't got a ha'penny, then God bless you'.* Many people in our local communities will struggle to feed themselves and their families this coming Christmas, let alone have an Advent Calendar to open each day.

If you'd like to help the food bank to support people and families who are struggling, here is another **Reverse** (**Pre-**) **Advent Calendar** which runs from Monday 24th November to Sunday 14th December. Not all of these items seem particularly Christmassy, but they are the things the food bank needs right now to support local people in need. Please set aside one item a day for the foodbank, rather than (or in addition to) opening a window and taking a chocolate/highland cow/dice/etc (delete as appropriate) from your Advent calendar. Starting and finishing this early means that the things we collect can get to the food bank in time to be distributed to those in need before Christmas.
